

PETER LAMBRINAKOS, O.O.M., CPP
CHIEF OF POLICE (RET'D)
CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER, IS3WARE
CANADA

Peter Lambrinakos is a nationally recognized public safety executive whose career has bridged police command, independent civilian oversight, critical infrastructure security, and the responsible governance of emerging technologies. A retired Chief of Police with more than three decades of senior policing and security leadership, he is the Chief Executive Officer of IS3WARE and a Commission Member of the Military Police Complaints Commission of Canada.

As Chief Executive Officer of IS3WARE, Mr. Lambrinakos leads the development of an AI-enabled conformance and governance platform that helps justice, public safety, and healthcare organizations manage cybersecurity, privacy, and regulatory compliance. His work reflects a broader commitment to strengthening trust, accountability, and institutional resilience in digital environments increasingly shaped by cybercrime, artificial intelligence, and transnational security threats.

Since June 2023, Mr. Lambrinakos has served as a Commission Member of the Military Police Complaints Commission of Canada, an independent civilian quasi-judicial body that reviews and investigates complaints concerning military police conduct and allegations of interference in military police investigations. In this role, he contributes to independent police oversight, administrative justice, and public confidence in policing.

Mr. Lambrinakos is also Co-Founder of the IJIS Institute's Center of Excellence on Artificial Intelligence for Justice, Public Safety, and Security, where he chairs the Police AI Governance and Advisory Council. The initiative convenes senior police executives and subject-matter experts to advance the responsible, ethical, and operationally sound adoption of artificial intelligence across policing, justice, and public safety institutions. He previously held the roles of Distinguished Fellow and Director of the Public Safety Program at the University of Ottawa's Professional Development Institute.

From 2015 to 2024, Mr. Lambrinakos was VIA Rail Canada's first Chief of Police and Chief of Corporate Security. He established and led the VIA Rail Canada Police Service, Canada's first dedicated police agency for intercity passenger rail, protecting critical national transportation infrastructure across a 12,500-kilometre network connecting more than 400 communities. He currently advises ALTO, Canada's high-speed rail project, on physical security.

Mr. Lambrinakos began his policing career in 1989 with the Montreal Police Service, rising from frontline patrol through the street gang and organized crime units to a series of senior commands. He created and led the Montreal Police Metro Unit, establishing a permanent police presence in one of North America's busiest transit systems, and went on to command Criminal Investigations and the Organized Crime Division. As Chief of the Major and Economic Crimes Division, he directed the homicide, sexual assault, child exploitation, robbery, arson, and fraud units, and developed Montreal's Mass Fatality Response Plan and its serial-crime and hostage-response command structures. He culminated his service as Chief

of Intelligence, overseeing criminal intelligence, national security, witness protection, and informant management. He also sat on Quebec's Police Counter-Terrorism Management Structure.

Internationally, Mr. Lambrinakos has represented Canada on the Strategic Council of the European Association of Railway Police Forces and served as North America's representative on the International Union of Railways Security Platform. He was an Advisory Board Member for the European Union's PROACTIVE project on CBRNe threat preparedness and currently serves on the Public Safety Advisory Board of Draganfly Inc. (NASDAQ: DPRO). He has also served on the boards of Operation Lifesaver Canada and St. John Ambulance Canada, Quebec Council.

Mr. Lambrinakos was invested as an Officer of the Order of Merit of the Police Forces by the Governor General of Canada and is a recipient of the Police Exemplary Service Medal. He holds a Bachelor of Commerce in Economics from McGill University, is a Board Certified Protection Professional, and serves as a lead instructor for the Advanced Executive Leadership Program at the Canadian Police College.
