Mr Christopher Ong Siu Jin has served as a prosecutor in the Attorney-General's Chambers of Singapore for over twenty-nine years, having joined the Singapore Legal Service immediately after graduating from the National University of Singapore with a Bachelor of Laws (Honours) in 1997. He is currently a Deputy Chief Prosecutor.



Christopher is widely recognised as a top criminal litigator, and a specialist in financial crime. In the course of his career as a prosecutor, he has prosecuted the entire gamut of crimes, from capital murder and drug trafficking cases in the High Court, to sexual offences and other crimes against persons, to complex financial crimes and money-laundering. He has also handled numerous appellate matters in the High Court and Court of Appeal of Singapore

Christopher is a pioneer and thought-leader in the fields of technology crime (“cybercrime”) and digital evidence, and heads the Crime Division’s Task Forces for Technology Crime and Cryptocurrency. He has been instrumental in shaping prosecution policies and legislation in these areas. He speaks regularly at international conferences, and has conducted training for the Commonwealth, UNODC and INTERPOL. He has also chaired Singapore’s annual hosting of the ASEAN Cybercrime Prosecutors’ Roundtable Meeting since its inception in 2016. He was also a key member of Singapore’s delegation to the United Nations’ negotiations for an international cybercrime convention, and is also currently Vice-President (Criminal Justice – Asia Pacific) of the Society for the Policing of Cyberspace, a non-governmental international organization engaged in cybercrime prevention, detection and response, built on a network of partners in the public and private sectors.

In 2025, Christopher was appointed Senior Counsel – Singapore’s equivalent of King’s Counsel – in recognition of his top-tier advocacy skills, professional integrity and knowledge of the law. For his service to Singapore, Christopher has also been awarded the Public Administration Medal (Silver) in 2024, and the Long Service Medal in 2020.
